



Fourth Sunday of Lent

At the 8:30 am Mass this week we will be celebrating the second scrutiny for those who are preparing to join the Church at the Easter vigil, especially for those who will be baptized. At Masses with a Scrutiny, the readings from Year A are used, as opposed to Year B which we are in now. The gospel for the second scrutiny is that of the man born

blind, which comprises the entire chapter 9 of the gospel according to John. It is not only about the miracle of curing someone who was born blind but also describes someone coming to deeper and deeper faith after his encounter with Jesus, concluding with his worship of Jesus despite its conflicts with family and the synagogue community. He goes from physical and interior darkness to light. At the other Masses the gospel is from John 3, part of Jesus' first meeting with Nicodemus which includes the comprehensive verse 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." It goes on to talk about choosing to believe in Jesus as the light of the world or preferring to remain in darkness. May you have a week of light.

As we get deeper into Lent, additional confession times will start to appear. This week the extra time is on Saturday, starting at 3:30 pm. I will also be working my way through the school confessions this week, and assisting at several other parishes during their extra confession times. Please select a time and parish to go to confession, and perhaps plan on going again in 2-3 months.

Another almsgiving option (in addition to the coin cups in the narthex, the Annual Catholic Appeal, our own parish collection, the special collection this weekend for the Gather and Grow food shelf, and the Good Friday collection for the upkeep of the holy sites in Israel and Palestine): try giving blood. There is a significant shortage right now. If you were not able to give at the KC-sponsored event last month, check redcross.org and enter your zip code, and you will find a nearby spot in the coming weeks.

This Friday is the St. Joseph Festival! In addition to the extremely popular Fish Fry (I believe the Knights of Columbus are averaging over 600 adults/week, plus children) there will be a Kid's Carnival at family-friendly prices, bingo, and other

extras. Please join me in purchasing raffle tickets - many of you have received them.

This week we also welcome Matt Birk, a Super Bowl Champion, a 15-year veteran of the National Football League and a devoted Catholic, who will be speaking to our high school students (and those from other area parishes) on Wednesday night. We are grateful for the grants which helped us to offer this opportunity.

On occasion, we have a 7:30 pm Sunday Mass in our chapel downstairs. Its main purposes are to provide a more youth-oriented Mass following Youth Group and to provide an option for those who work the 7:00 am-7:00 pm shift on weekends. Our next Mass is this weekend, but then we are off through Easter. We have scheduled for next year – almost always the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month, September through April. We will communicate more completely as September approaches, but please know that there is that option, several times a month. We have tried to communicate to nurses through the hospital and assisted living places but are unsure it was effective.

Remember we have Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm every Friday during Lent. The school also does them at 2:00 pm. Attendance has been low at the 7:00 pm time. Can you suggest a better time, such as 3:30 pm before the fish fry opens?

What are you doing for Lent? Are you trying something in each of the traditional and effective ways of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving?

We are looking for an additional person to be at Eucharistic Adoration from 5:00-6:00 pm on Tuesdays. When that is filled, we want to start on Monday at 9:00 pm through Tuesday at 9:00 am as some people are asking for the overnight option to resume as it had been before the pandemic.



WHY DO WE KNEEL FOLLOWING MASS?

Please join us in our custom of kneeling down after Mass to pray an Our Father, a Hail Mary, and a Glory Be to the Father. For many years at St. Joseph, the Parishioners pause and kneel after Mass to say a prayer for the next person in our parish family to be born and the next to pass away and for vocations to consecrated life.



WHY DO WE REMAIN STANDING AFTER THE GOSPEL IS READ?

Standing for the proclamation of the Gospel is a sign of respect. It has been a common prayer posture since the early Christians. Here at St. Joseph, we remain standing until after the Gospel book, in which are found the words of Christ himself, is enthroned. Simply put, Jesus should be the first to sit down. Once He is sitting or enthroned, then we can sit.

Order of Christian Initiation Candidates & Catechumens

ORDER of CHRISTIAN INITIATION

The OCIA process has several distinct stages. These Catholic OCIA stages are a good model of faith development itself.

- Inquiry: the initial period before you decide to enter the Catholic Church. You're asking questions and checking it out, but aren't yet ready to commit.
- Catechumenate: those who decide to enter the Church and are being trained for a life in Christ are called catechumens, an ancient name from the early Church. In this stage, you're developing your faith and are being "catechized"—learning catechism, or the basic points about Catholic faith and life.
- Purification & Preparation: The Church will help you focus and intensify your faith as you prepare to commit your life to Christ and be received into the Church at Easter.
- **Initiation** itself, the culmination of the whole process! You're received into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass, where you'll receive the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. (*If you've already been baptized, you won't be baptized again.*)
- Mystagogy: after reception into the Church at Easter, this period lets you reflect and learn more about the mysteries of the Mass and the Sacraments that you now participate in fully.






