



Third Sunday of Easter

Welcome to Fr. Bower who is here this weekend to speak about the ministry of Cross Catholic Outreach. One of their efforts in recent years has been digging wells in Africa. During Lent of 2023, we raised enough money to have one dug in Africa. Fr. Bower will share about their many ministries around the world.

I have some important information about our school. In recent months, the school board undertook a process called Accelerating the Organization, as I reported some weeks back. The effort is to result in a more efficient and effective organization, and being good stewards of the resources given to the school. A third-party international expert assisted us in this at no cost. The school board has since adopted its recommendations. The first will result in a change in the *model* of leadership at St. Joseph School.

The leadership model will have two components:

- Head of School Deacon Bruce Richard will take on this role.
- Principal Amy Gallus, a teacher at our school for the past 10 years, and formerly a principal in a Catholic elementary school, will take on this role, with a bit of teaching as well.

The Head of School is ultimately responsible for the Catholic faith formation of staff, students, and families, as well as overall educational excellence. With the Principal managing the day-to-day academic affairs of the school, the Head of School will have the capacity for other very crucial tasks. These include visioning, long-range planning, ensuring alignment of curriculum to vision, strategic goal setting and execution, safety and security, financial management, budgeting, scholarship distribution, public relations and marketing, working with the school board, alumni relations, and high-level fundraising. The Head of School and the Principal will share hiring responsibilities.

The Principal will have primary responsibility for academic excellence and the day-to-day academic affairs of the school, including professional development, curriculum development, master scheduling, faculty coaching and evaluation, internal communications, working with the school board, supervision of extended day program, and handling student affairs. The Principal will have equal responsibility, along with the Head of School, for the Catholic faith formation of the students.

Congratulations to both Deacon Bruce Richards and Ms. Amy Gallus in their new roles! Stay tuned for additional information in the coming months.

In recent years there have been over 100,000 deaths annually due to drug overdose in the US alone. Since the year 2000, the rate of deaths has quadrupled. More than 1,000,000 deaths have come from opioid overdose in the past 20 years alone. Many more die from other drugs. It affects our community. Scott and Kris Post's 22-year-old son, Sawyer, died from it in 2021. I presided at the funeral. They want to help other parents to not have that heartbreak. Here is a poem they wrote. We will share more next week.

EMPTY ROOM

His room sits empty.

A fresh coat of paint perhaps but it does not cover the love that once filled it and it does not brighten the tears that now flow in it.

His chair is where I sit now, trying to remember all who he was, trying to avoid the anger of why he is no longer here.

I regret the anger each time it rises and eagerly try to understand it was a mistake. His mistake. My mistake. Plenty of lessons to go around.

He promised me he would never do anything to hurt me but he did just that, he hurt me.

He was such a good boy, full of love, full of life. So why? This is a question that won't be answered until we meet again.

The lessons of his life are numerous in number but the greatest lesson is to know God before you need Him.

Parents be the voice that your child hears above all the noise.

Look out for each other, block the mistakes when someone is feeling invincible. Be the Shepherd!

Just say no! Gone are the days of experimenting. Drugs are drugged, one pill kills!

Any decision you make is not just about you. Remember, those who love you, once you are gone, break! The pain doesn't leave for those you leave behind.


