


Pentecost May 19, 2024



Know, Love, and Serve the Lord



This weekend, we celebrate Pentecost, the birth of the Church, the day the Holy Spirit came down upon the apostles, Mary, and the other people who were gathered and praying. It is also the final day of the Easter season. Pentecost was/is a feast of pilgrimage on the Jewish religious calendar. It was better known to them as the Feast of

the Weeks, coming 50 days after Passover. It was originally an agricultural feast for the first fruits of the year ... a winter wheat harvest. (There was also a fall harvest festival, Sukkot, or Tabernacles, usually in September.) The Feast of the Weeks became connected to the reception of the 10 Commandments and the conclusion of the covenant. This celebration was the reason why so many Jews from around the world gathered in Jerusalem that day.

Ordinary time returns on Monday. We do have two more special Sunday feasts - next weekend will be Trinity Sunday, and the one after that will be the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. That way, we will again have a short procession around half the block if the weather and road conditions allow. That will take place after the 8:30 am Mass.

This coming Saturday, Archbishop Hebda will ordain 13 men to the priesthood to serve in our Archdiocese. One of them, Hjalmar Gudjonsson, has been living with me several days a week these past few months as he was teaching theology at Holy Family Catholic High School. This class of 13 is the largest since 2005, I think. Next year, there are six expected to be ordained, and the following year currently has five in that class. The year after that has no one - partially due to the addition of an extra year of preparation before beginning the graduate-level courses in theology. You are all welcome to attend the beautiful ordination service at the Cathedral on Saturday, May 25 at 10:00 am. Our teaching parish seminarian, Monico, is from the diocese of Boise, Idaho, so when he is ordained, that will take place in Idaho.

St. Joseph Catholic STEM School will hold its graduation with a Mass at 6:00 pm on Monday, May 20 (this coming Monday). Note the time change for Mass this Monday - 6:00 pm rather than 6:30 pm. All are welcome to attend. The graduation ceremony itself will take place after Mass.

I was assigned to St. Joseph in 2018, it was for a six-year term which will end on June 30. I received a letter this past week extending this assignment for up to another six years. I am

68 years old now. Usually, retirement is at age 70, but I plan to remain here until age 72 ... then we will see.

While our local synod is over, implementation of its resolutions continues. Our evangelization team will be meeting on Sunday afternoon to assess this past spring's efforts and plan an expansion of small groups in the fall. There is a special focus on the Eucharist for the next year as far as material covered in the group meetings, but it won't necessarily be limited to that topic. The dream is that someday all Catholics in our Archdiocese will be in a small group. We recognize it will take some years to change the culture to achieve that. But please, plan on being part of a small group next fall. Talk to those who were in it this Spring. I believe everyone enjoyed the experience. I anticipate there will be more options being offered. We could use some more co-leaders to provide those opportunities. Thank you.

On Wednesday of this week, we will celebrate a Baccalaureate Mass (aka Cap & Gown Mass) with our High School Seniors at 7:00 pm. A small reception will follow. We encourage all graduating seniors to wear their caps and gowns and help us celebrate with them. Congratulations to all of you! Four years ago, you were cheated of most of your grade school celebrations due to COVID-19.

A week from Monday, we will celebrate Memorial Day Mass at 8:15 am in our parish cemetery, which is just south of Highway 5 on Hartmann Road. Bring a lawn chair. As part of the service, we will read the names of all buried there who served in the military. The American Legion will arrive at 9:15 am to do their rituals. If the weather is bad, we will celebrate Mass in the church instead. There will be no afternoon confessions or 6:30 pm Mass celebrated on Memorial Day. The office will be closed as well.

With the road work around the church, traffic is being detoured to 1st Street, between the church and the education building. This quiet street has suddenly become much busier, so be careful as you cross the street. Remember: crosswalks can be your friends!

# MAY CROWNING

Mass with the School | May 1, 2023

Mass was celebrated with the School on Wednesday, May 1, the feast of St. Joseph the Worker. It was also celebrated in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary which has a longstanding Catholic tradition called May Crowning. A "May Crowning" is typically held, where Mary is presented with a floral crown. Lilies were bestowed into a basket before the statue. Marian hymns were sung by the school choir throughout Mass as our kindergarten students were the ministers. This was a beautiful Mass that honors the queenship of Mary as the mother of Jesus. Note that we do not view Mary as a goddess, nor do we worship Mary; she is honored or venerated as the mother of Christ, the most important woman in our Catholic faith. Mary is honored through pilgrimages, sacrifices, visits to church, and other customs as our Mother. She gave birth to that Body, making her our own mother; thus giving birth to us spiritually.

Confirmation | April 28

Congratulations to the 40 10<sup>th</sup> graders from St. Joseph who received the Sacrament of Confirmation on Sunday, April 28 by Bishop Izens at the Basilica of St. Mary. Confirmation deepens our baptismal life and calls us to be missionary witnesses of Jesus Christ in our families, neighborhoods, society, and the world. Through Confirmation, our personal relationship with Christ is strengthened. We receive the message of faith in a deeper and more intensive manner with great emphasis given to the person of Jesus Christ, who asked the Father to give the Holy Spirit to the Church for building up the community in loving service. The Holy Spirit bestows

seven gifts—wisdom, understanding, knowledge, fortitude, counsel, piety, and fear of the Lord—to assist us in our mission and witness. The impact of these gifts accompanies us in the various stages of our spiritual development. When we are responsive to the grace of Confirmation and the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, we begin to bear the fruits of the Spirit. The tradition of the Church names twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity (cf. CCC, no. 1832; Gal 5:22). Congratulations to these students and their families!








