


This weekend we will have parish representatives in the narthex after Mass to answer questions about small group possibilities for you, some starting in September. You can register for some of these online this weekend. Additional ones, our "legacy groups" which have been around for at least 2-8 years, will be available for sign-up soon. We aim over the year to have these ways of study, prayer, interaction, and fellowship to be the way our, and all parishes in the Archdiocese. We continue with the PECS small

group method this year. Many of them will have content that specifically addresses the Eucharist and the celebration of the Mass. Please give this a try. Some of these are 5-8 sessions, and the one I will teach about an overview of Catholicism. This group will meet several times a month through Easter as we journey with those in OCIA, who are considering becoming Catholic. Look online or talk to our representatives after Mass for more information!

For several weeks we will be hearing from the Bread of Life discourse from the sixth chapter of John as our weekend Gospel readings. It began two weeks ago with one of the stories of the feeding of the multitude. As many of you have heard me say, this is the only miracle that appears in all four Gospels and is actually recounted six times - sometimes with different numbers of those being fed or a different number of loaves and/or fish. Again as I have said, they all have the same shape: people have gathered, Jesus teaches them, and bread is

brought forward. It is blessed, broken, and given to the people to eat. Fragments are collected and the people are dismissed. That is the shape of the Mass: people gather, we hear scripture and a homily, bread (and wine) are brought forward, it is blessed (consecrated), broken, and given to the people to eat (communion), and then people are dismissed to live their Christian lives in the world.

Last weekend began the bread of life discussion. In the meantime, Jesus sent his disciples off in a boat to cross the Sea of Galilee. He later comes to them, walking on the Sea. They land at Capharnaum; which is where Jesus had his headquarters, in a sense. Those who had been fed, come looking for him, wanting more bread. Jesus says he himself is the bread of life. It is more satisfying than the manna the Israelites received in the desert, for they ate that but ultimately died. We who eat the Eucharist will never die – eternity is a possibility for us. But these people we met last week, have missed the real miracle. They were looking only to avoid hunger. At the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Sr. Josephine Garrett spoke about these readings. Among the many jewels of her talk was her insight that we want to be full and not hunger. Our desire to be full, she said, is not faulty. The problem is when we are not ok with hunger. We live under the illusion that we should never be hungry. But that is not the world lesus was in, not what is promised to us, and not what Jesus himself accepted. We depart, as we see many of the disciples do, to a false self-sufficiency. We can become tired of waiting. We struggle with being brokenhearted and wounded and do not wish to revisit those wounds. But it is exactly there where God has done His greatest work. If we stick to the Sacraments and repent, we will be healed, we will be full, perhaps not here on earth. We are and will be broken pilgrims, but healing starts with repentance. So, repent in hope and joy. Be open to being loved, and you will be filled. I will write more throughout the month.




