

Election Day is Tuesday, November 5. You

open as usual, roughly from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, every day. Stop in to pray on Election Day for the country and the candidates, and the following days to pray for healing regardless of who is elected. The chapel downstairs is open to pray in as well. On Tuesdays, we have Eucharistic Adoration from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm.

We are entering the final weeks of the Church year. The final Sunday of the year, Christ the King of the Universe, is in three weeks. Advent begins December 1. A card and letter from me will be reaching mailboxes just before Thanksgiving about various Advent activities, extended confession times, other events, and Christmas Mass times. While it seems a little premature to write about Advent, it is much less so than to have seen stores decked out for Christmas for weeks.

We will be offering a special experience during Advent. This will be a mini-course on the infancy narratives (Christmas stories) found in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. There will be three classes, December 2, 9, and 16. We will meet in the parish center after the 6:30 pm Mass. No need to sign up. There will be some refreshments of an Advent theme, and the core of the time will be me presenting about the infancy narratives in Luke and Matthew, and about the Old Testament birth stories. There will be some music and prayer time as well. Think of it as a respite from the rest of the world.

We are also planning to facilitate Taize prayer sessions during Advent. You know and like some of the Taize music, such as Jesus, Remember Me, and Vene Sancte Spiritus. The music is usually very short phrases, repeated in calm, meditative ways, and very easy to learn. The prayer experience includes a lot of candlelight. This will be part of the first Advent mini-course class on December 2. It will also be offered on December 18, and again on Friday, December 20.

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT WORKING ON THE MARGINS

he Catholic Church teaches the fundamental importance of paying workers a living wage that allows them to meet their basic needs. Cooperative businesses are co-owned by the employees, which gives workers greater say in how the business is run, including the wages and salaries that workers earn. Those principles animate the work of the organizations creating opportunities and fighting poverty with support from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).


Seed Commons is a New York City-based national network of community loan funds that make cooperative businesses easier to start and less expensive than obtaining bank loans. Based on a "nonextractive" model, Seed Commons does not require borrowers to make payments on interest or principal until they can cover operating expenses, including market-rate salaries. With support from CCHD, Seed Commons helps workers become

cooperative owners who earn living wages at companies like a Chicago-based window manufacturer, which pays \$2/hour more than it did before it became a cooperative. The employee-owners now earn not only higher wages but profit-sharing checks as well.

Your support of CCHD helps workers become worker-owners who earn living wages and establish economic roots in communities that badly need greater employment and earning opportunities. When you give to the CCHD collection, you help not only national networks like Seed Commons but also organizations working to end poverty within your diocese, where 25% of your contribution stays to create opportunities in your own neighborhood.






