We have almost made it to the end of the church year. The Year of Grace 2025 begins with the first day of Advent, with the Saturday evening Mass on November 30. This Sunday is the feast of Christ the King of the Universe. Today's readings are about Christ as King, but not a king as the world sees them. It is not about grasping after power or displaying wealth and status,

but about being the king who is about to die on the cross, who sees the Cross as a throne and gives his life for his people. The readings on the coming weekdays are from the Book of Revelation and the final week of Jesus' life from Luke, with many end-time stories.

Advent is a time to prepare for two things: the celebration of the birth of Jesus when he came the first time and the preparation for his second coming. As Deacon Greg said in his homily last weekend, it is good to take some time to be quiet during these three and one-half weeks we have. I encourage you to try some of the quiet times we have planned: a candlelit Taize prayer service on December 2, 10, 18, or 20. Or morning prayer in our downstairs chapel each weekday during Advent, joining people around the world in reciting lauds, or morning prayer at 7:00 am. This part of the Liturgy of the Hours takes about 15 minutes. Then stay for quiet prayer or be on your way. Eucharistic Adoration has hours on Monday (5:00 pm-9:00 pm), Tuesday (9:00 am-9:00 pm), Wednesday (5:00 pm-10:00 pm) and Thursday (4:30 pm-9:00 pm). Daily Mass is another option. If you are more interested in learning something and mixing it into your prayer, come to the 3-part Advent program where I will be presenting the history, theology, and some of the sights and sounds of the first Christmas through the Scriptures - the nativity account according to Luke, with the annunciation, visitation, census, angels and shepherds, and the one in Matthew with the star, the magi, the flight to Egypt. We will also look at some of the other nativity stories from the Old Testament as time allows: Isaac, Samson, Samuel, and others. Finally, after Mass this weekend, we will be handing out a book with daily reflections for the entire month of December.

Please come to at least one of the Thanksgiving celebrations: Either at 9:00 am on Thanksgiving Day as we celebrate the Eucharist (a Greek word meaning thanks) and/ or Tuesday night at 7:00 pm as we host the Ecumenical

Prayer service. There will be some refreshments and treats afterward. Enjoy the day with family and friends and give thanks to God!

Plans are moving ahead for me to move to 4 South Pine. We are getting some new furniture for it, as there is none left there. Some from the current rectory will be moved there as well. There is some patching and painting to be done. It is possible some of the cracks were due to the street construction work this past summer/fall, and we are looking into whether we can get some compensation for that. The goal is to have the first floor ready around December 1. There is no rush for me to actually start living there, so it might be a few more weeks before that truly happens.

Like last year, we are a little behind in collections during the first four months of the year, but we are ahead of last year. Yet, if you wish to give a little more, or haven't increased your giving for a few years, we would appreciate you responding generously.

December 1 will be the 15th anniversary of the Episcopal Ordination of Archbishop Bernard Hebda. He had been working in Rome for 13 years interpreting canon law and was named Bishop of Gaylord, Michigan, a very rural diocese in central Michigan, nothing like Rome or his home city of Pittsburgh. In 2013, he was named coadjutor of Newark, New Jersey, and then, when Archbishop Neinstedt resigned here, he was made administrator of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis in addition to his other duties in Newark. On Holy Thursday of 2016, he was named to be our Archbishop. We are lucky to have him. Prior to priesthood, he graduated from Harvard (*in three years!*) and then went to Columbia for Law School. He practiced for a year, and then after a year of philosophy, went to seminary at North American College in Rome. He was ordained a deacon in Rome and a priest in 1989, in Pittsburgh.


JOYFULLY PREPARING for ADVENT Advent cards for every household in the Parish!

Your efforts have truly helped spread the joy of Advent to our parish family-thank you!


