







Happy New Year! We are now a quarter of the way through this century, and halfway through this decade. I know that is obvious, but it still shocks me. We used to talk about going back to the '50s, but now it is just 25 years to the 50s.

A quick review of event from 2024 at 2024 at the parish includes the following:

- Small groups of the PECS version were launched at the beginning of Lent with a series on prayer. A second wave began in September with a variety of topics.
- St. Joseph hosted the Pro-Life luncheon in January.
- We held both a men's and women's Welcome retreat.
- KCs hosted a blood drive in February
- We finished the fiscal year with a surplus of about \$188,000.
- About 4,000 people were fed at the six Knights of Columbus fish fries during Lent.
- · We graduated a full class of 24 students from our
- The school went through a process evaluating their

- administration resulting in a number of changes in operations and personnel. After some growing pains, it is starting to show positive effects.
- We had 25 funerals, 12 weddings, and 39 baptisms, over 1,000 confessions, and more than 450 Masses.
- A number of parishioners were among the 7,000 people who participated in the Source and Summit Eucharistic procession in St. Paul.
- · Dick Bremer spoke at the KC's Family, Faith, and Baseball Event in May.
- Thirteen people in the OCIA group received a variety of initiation sacraments.
- Three Teams of Our Lady groups were formed late in 2023 and completed their first year.
- At least four people from our parish attended the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis in July.
- · Longtime employees Sandy Rosetter and Bonnie Delaney retired; Sheila Wald and Rachel Provence were hired in their stead.
- The Knights of Columbus Council #2506 won the Star Council award for the second year in a row.

- Sean Barker took employment at another parish. Elizabeth Hoffman is now directing our music program.
- The Little Ringers bell choir began, with participants as young as 3 years old.
- We purchased the Peterson House at 4 South Pine. It will soon become the rectory.
- St. Joseph was selected as a pilot parish for the Archdiocesan capital campaign, Lord Renew Your Church. The parish will retrain 60% of whatever it raises.
- One hundred families received a turkey and "fixings" to prepare their Thanksgiving meal.
- A garage was donated to the parish and placed near the 129 Main property we own. In the spring a foundation will be built for it, and then we will be able to use or lease it.
- Almost 600 coats were given away at the Winterwear drive.
- Over 100 Christmas gifts were provided to children of incarcerated parents...
- An electronic sign was installed near the Food Shelf, donated by the KCs as a legacy gift marking 100 years as a council. It will be used by the parish, school, and food shelf.
- Wednesday, January 1 is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and a Holy Day of Obligation. We will have Masses at 9:00 am and 5:15 pm on Wednesday. No vigil Mass the night before.




Find Jesus in the caravan traveling to Jerusalem.
