


Baptism of the Lord





A couple of weeks ago, I attended the opening Mass for the Jubilee Year of Hope at the Cathedral of St. Paul, celebrated by Archbishop Hebda. It was a beautiful liturgy where the Archbishop explained the Jubilee Year of Hope and how we, as a local Church, can participate.

WHAT IS A JUBILEE YEAR?

A Jubilee Year in the Catholic Church is a profound celebration of God's mercy, forgiveness, and restoration, traditionally observed every 25 years. Rooted in the Jewish tradition described in Leviticus 25, the Jubilee reflects themes of liberation, reconciliation, and renewal. In ancient Israel, it occurred every 50 years and was marked by freeing slaves, forgiving debts, and restoring ancestral lands—a time of social and spiritual restoration emphasizing God's justice and mercy.

The Catholic Church adopted this tradition in 1300 under Pope Boniface VIII, introducing the "Holy Year" as a time for the faithful to renew their commitment to Christ and receive special graces through pilgrimages, prayers, and reconciliation. A central symbol of the Jubilee is the opening of the Holy Doors in Rome's major basilicas: St. Peter's, St. John Lateran, St. Mary Major, and St. Paul Outside the Walls, as well as a fifth door at Rebibbia Prison. These doors symbolize Christ as the door to salvation.


THE 2025 JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE

Proclaimed by Pope Francis, the 2025 Jubilee Year focuses on Hope, a virtue encouraging trust in God's promises and inspiring action toward a just and compassionate world. This theme resonates deeply in our times, offering a beacon of renewal.

Key Elements of the 2025 Celebration:

- Pilgrimage: Travel to Rome to pass through the Holy Doors, reflecting on your spiritual journey. If unable to travel, visit a local pilgrimage site, such as the Cathedral of St. Paul or the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis.
- Sacraments: Go to Confession and attend Mass to receive Communion.
- Acts of Mercy: While in a state of grace, perform a work of mercy, addressing poverty, injustice, or ecological stewardship.

A Tradition of Renewal: The Jubilee Year reflects the essence of the Jewish Jubilee: recalibrating lives toward God's will and emphasizing freedom and restoration through His mercy. The 2025 Jubilee calls all to be bearers of hope, living as instruments of God's love and healing in a world longing for renewal.

The Baptism of the Lord and the Jubilee Year: The Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, which concludes the Christmas season, deepens the Jubilee Year's message of hope and renewal. In the Gospel, Jesus' baptism reveals Him as the beloved Son of God and inaugurates His public ministry. This moment highlights themes of restoration central to the Jubilee Year.

Through baptism, we are called to live in grace, hope, and mission, echoing the Jubilee's invitation to turn our lives toward God. The sacrament reminds us of our identity as children of God and strengthens our call to share His love and mercy. Just as the heavens opened at Christ's baptism, the Holy Doors of the Jubilee symbolize an open path to salvation and a profound opportunity for spiritual renewal.

Plenary Indulgence: During the Jubilee Year, the Church grants plenary indulgences to those fulfilling the "Key Elements of the 2025 Celebration," provided they meet the following conditions:

- Detachment from sin, even venial sin.
- Confession within about 20 days.
- Receiving Communion and praying for the Pope's intentions (e.g., an Our Father and Hail Mary).

Each indulgence requires a separate Communion and prayer, ideally on the day of the indulgenced act. Only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day, with a second possible if applied to souls in purgatory.

The Jubilee Year of Hope is not merely an event but a profound call to live as instruments of God's restorative justice. It echoes the eternal rhythm of His mercy and love, inviting us to embrace and share His hope with the world.

Take a closer step to heaven everyone, and don't go alone! Have a blessed week!

Saint Joseph was a **tekton**. So was Jesus. This Greek word translates to artisan, craftsman, carpenter, woodworker, or builder. The word **architect**, for instance, is the **arch** (chief) **tekton** (builder). This makes Jesus the Chief Tekton of the universe.
