


Epiphany of the Lord







On December 24, Pope Francis opened the Holy Door for this Holy Year of 2025. Pope Boniface VIII proclaimed the first Jubilee year in 1300. The Christian Jubilee is a spiritual reinterpretation of ancient Hebrew tradition described in the book of Leviticus that proclaimed a Jubilee year every 50 years that released slaves, forgave debts, and reconciled adversaries. Pope Boniface initially expected there would be a Holy Year once a century, but there was one in 1350, and it has typically been

every 25 years since 1475. There have been some special ones, such as the Year of Mercy in 2016. The theme for this year is the Year of Hope. It is also to mark the 1,700th anniversary of the first ecumenical council, the Council of Nicea in 325. Archbishop Hebda presided at a Mass to commemorate the opening of the Holy Year with a Mass at the Cathedral last Sunday.

There will be some changes to staff coming up, but at this writing, I cannot say exactly what. As reported some months ago, Cheryl Salz will be retiring at the end of the month. Her position is being reevaluated and will become more about adult education rather than parish life. That will affect some tasks currently assigned to other staff. There will be a farewell for Cheryl after the Tuesday Mass on January 21. Please take that opportunity, or sometime before to wish Cheryl well. There are many other areas under her purview, such as Woman of Joy, Boomers & Beyond, and more.

Our administrative assistant, Sheila Wald, who just started in October, has taken a position similar to what she had done before moving to Minnesota. We are sorry to see her leave. She did a good job while she was here. I am happy to say she plans to remain living in Waconia and be a parishioner here.

At a recent meeting, where we discussed changing roles in the staff, the parish council supported me in considering adding to the staff to right-size some job descriptions and better staff the themes the parish council has endorsed for the next year or two. As our ideas are still fluid, I will ask you to wait for some more information on that.

I will be on vacation this weekend and the coming week. I'm grateful to my brother priests for filling in during my absence. At this Saturday evening Mass and all weekday Masses, Fr. Joseph Bambenek will preside. A Hastings native ordained in 2010, he served in parishes for about 10 years and now works at the Archdiocese as Assistant Director of the Office for the Renewal of Structures and the Office of Synod Evangelization. Fr. Bambenek holds a bachelor's degree in physics from MIT and three master's degrees: nuclear engineering, technology and policy, and divinity. On Sunday, January 5, both Masses will be celebrated by Fr. Bobby Pish, the parochial vicar at St. Bartholomew in Wayzata. Fr. Pish, also ordained in 2010, has a business degree from the University of Pennsylvania, has served as Vice Rector and Associate Dean of the Saint Paul Seminary, and has studied psychology with experience in private practice. Next Saturday, January 11, Mass will be celebrated by Fr. Jim Devorak, a retired priest who often assists at St. Nicholas in Carver and was formerly pastor of Immaculate Conception in Watertown.


WHY DO WE KNEEL FOLLOWING MASS?

WHY DO WE REMAIN STANDING AFTER THE GOSPEL IS READ?

Standing for the proclamation of the Gospel is a sign of respect. It has been a common prayer posture since the early Christians. Here at St. Joseph, we remain standing until after the Gospel book, in which are found the words of Christ himself, is enthroned. Simply put, Jesus should be the first to sit down. Once He is sitting or enthroned, then we can sit.





The Magi found baby Jesus. They never told Herod.


